Light Messages Publishing: www.lightmessages.com. Publisher website that has numerous resources for learning Creole. I would highly recommend the book and/or CD/Workbook set, Creole Made Easy by Wally Turnbull for those just beginning with Creole. This website also sells a Creole cook book, recipes, coloring book, and book of Haitian proverbs.
